Evolution

On the grand philosophical scale modern biology still takes evolution for granted. In articles intended for the general public, evolution is seldom called in question. But on the technical level, and in the interpretation of facts, disagreement, doubt, and confusion abound.

Consider, for example, the study of taxonomy, the classification of living things. Man has always organized plants and animals into groups for convenience of study, but if evolution is true, classification also implies descent. If everything living today arose from earlier, simpler forms, we should be able, with enough study to say what came from what. But biologists cannot do this. There is little agreement about how living things should be classified in relation to each other. Relationships that were once considered certain are now thought doubtful. A prime reason for the unsettled condition of taxonomy is that the fossil record does not support evolution. Plants and animals appear for the first time substantially as they are now.

The following quotations from the New Encyclopaedia Britannica will illustrate what I mean:

“Because of the lack of fossils, the evolutionary course of the Cacti is difficult to trace” (Vol. 3, p. 575).

“The earliest reliable fossils already show the differentiation of flowering plants into many distinct families” (vol. 18, p. 1092).

“The fossil record of bats prior to the Pleistocene (about 2,500,000 years ago) is limited and reveals little about bat evolution. Most fossils can be attributed to living families” (vol. 4, p. 434).

“The earliest known rodents came from the late Paleocene (about 57,000,000 years ago) of North America, by which time they had already acquired all of the diagnostic features of the order” (vol. 15, p. 976).

“There is little unanimity among botanists, however, as to how the family oleaceae (the olives) should be classified” (vol. 13, p. 558).

“Fossils have contributed little, as yet, to the understanding of salamander evolution . . . The relationships of urodeles (salamanders) to other living and fossil amphibians are unclear...” (vol. 18, p. 1087).

“The fossil record is of little assistance in attempting to determine which group of flowering plants appeared first on earth” (vol. 11, p. 343).

“Palms stand by themselves in terms of evolution. They do not appear to be very closely related to any other order of flowering plants unless it be the order Cyclanthales, nor can they be derived from any present or past group of plants” (vol. 1, p. 1133).

The last quotation (and these are just random examples) is revealing. How can palms “stand by themselves in terms of evolution”? If evolution is true, nothing stands by itself! Evolutionists live in hope that when more fossils are discovered, these large gaps in our knowledge will be filled in, but already it should be apparent that this is not going to happen.

So a few brave souls are venturing to question the assumptions of Darwin. One such assumption is the principle of uniformitarianism, “the present is the key to the past.” Uniformitarianism assumes a long and tranquil history for the earth, a view which directly opposes the biblical teaching about at least one worldwide calaclysm, the flood of Noah. But today some researchers believe that a comet striking the earth may have killed off the dinosaurs. We know that mammoths found under polar ice died suddenly with grass in their mouths, and were frozen so quickly that the sled dogs of the explorers could eat their flesh without ill effect.

It has recently been proposed that the basic forms of life were brought to earth on a spaceship. As ridiculous as this theory is, it has more to commend it than Darwin’s.
